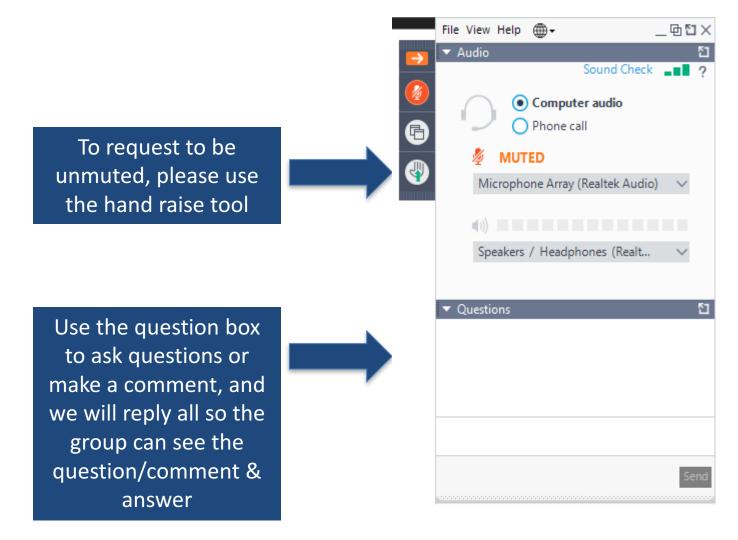

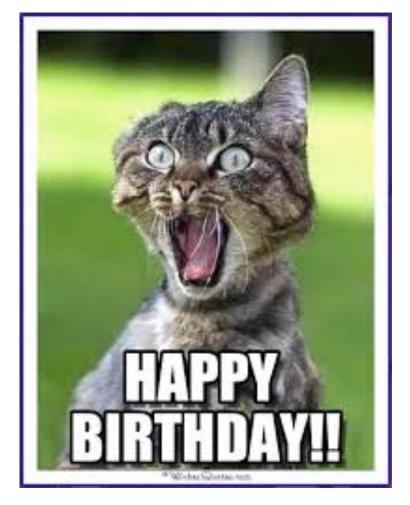

What are "Interstate Financial Reporting" (IFR) Criteria & why create them?

- States asked for it to enable crossstate comparisons of school spending.
- Optional!!
- Meeting the minimum criteria = more peers for comparison
- States may (and likely will) choose to report more than minimum IFR.





High-Level Assumptions of the IFR Criteria

- a) Across states, districts, schools: Accounting varies.
 Budgets vary. Delivery varies. That's ok.
- b) It is better if **LEAs feel ownership** for spending reports.
- c) Spending reports **can be flexible** for use across the different types of schooling.
- d) Most critical number for comparison = Total PPE (and not the spending on any one portion of the delivery model).



More specifics on IFR:

- e) IFR aims to capture all relevant public funds (minus exclusions). Funds can be spent by school, district, CMO, or used to pay vendors.
- f) The IFR allows separating:
 - -- site level costs
 - -- site's share of central costs,
 - but does not prescribe how to separate the two. What matters for comparisons across schools is the grand total.
- g) States differ in how they capture "enrollment", and should report their method (ADA, one day count, ADM, etc.). Students should not be "weighted".

- Always exclude: Adult education, capital expenditures, debt, pass-through funds, transfers, tuition.
- Optional to exclude (state discretion): pre-K, food services, community services, equipment.
- Always report sum of all exclusions (I).
- Always report <u>what</u> was excluded (J).

 - Student performance by school (growth, achievement, subgroup breakouts, etc.)
- Uncovering innovation/Exploring efficiency:
 - More financial data (object, function, program etc.)
